Child Road Safety

Better transport infrastructure supports economic development. It supports lower cost transport and therefore economic advantage. It gives access to health and education. It enables mobility to get access to more job opportunities. For children, roads are literally the roads to the future. The roads lead to learning, opportunity and success. They connect children to communities, to education, to health, to culture, to commerce and to their and our future.

The road should be the best friend of our children. The reality is different. A million children and adolescents are killed or seriously injured on the roads each year. Road traffic accidents are the number 1 killer of children between the ages of 5 and youth.

Thanks to the Millennium Development Goals there is a strong emphasis on ensuring that children survive until they reach the age of 5. Once they turn 5, their chances of surviving disease and malnutrition increase substantially. Then they go to primary school, which also is the moment that they are on their own and the biggest killer in their world is just outside of their door.

Collaboration between humanitarian organisations, corporate organisations, civil society and academia can have a substantial impact on child road safety. Effective collaboration can be a tool to reach children and their parents and teach them how to use the road as a positive tool towards their future.
